

GRAFFIETTI STAMPATI OPERATING NOTES

PHOTOGRAPHIC SUBJECTS

- The file names must not contain /#•\$%@ or any other special symbols.
- The file names must not start or end with a full stop or space.
- Do not use JPEG (JPG) or LZW compressions, etc.
- EPS, TIFF format (not generic, but Photoshop) with resolution of at least 300 DPI = 1:1.
- Any layouts (with polygonal value of -8-) recorded with the work.
- Subjects 1/2/3/4 pant. tones recorded in EPS with screen half-tones, selecting line, angle and type of dot on the basis of the paper quality.
- Colour separation in CMYK, without additional channels (NO RGB).

MAKE-UP

- Carried out using Quark X-Press version 5.xx or 6.0 for Macintosh
- Document format must be in finished work format.
- Unset the margins for any photos/backgrounds for clean cuts (minimum 3 mm).
- Separation of all colours in CMYK except PANTONE colours.
- Separation of colours in CMYK except PANTONE colours, in inserted EPS files created using other graphics programs (i.e. Adobe Illustrator) and assign any overprinting and trapping.
- Remove all unused elements from outside the page format.
- Proof (in colour) of the definitive document (possibly low resolution PDF).
- For high quality photos, attach contractual colour proof.

PC MAKE-UP

- Carried out using Quark X-Press version 5.xx or 6.0 for PC (use Mac equivalent fonts)
- Carried out using Corel Draw program, exported like Adobe Illustrator for Mac (.AI) with text curves
- Carried out using Adobe Illustrator program (use Mac equivalent fonts or text curves)

FONTS

- Insert all the characters used in the make-up and in any inserted EPS images created using other graphics programs (i.e. Adobe Illustrator) complete with FONT VIDEOS with relative POSTSCRIPT FILES for printing.

- "Make-up" folder
- "Photo/Logo" folder
- "Font" folder

RECEPTION SUPPORTS

- 1.44 Mb Macintosh format discs.
- 100 Mb Iomega Zip discs.

PDF FILES

- Adobe Acrobat 4.0/5.0. The specific settings for the creation of the PDF document should be agreed with the pre-printing department.
